CAPS Webinars

Susan presented two webinars in the previous weeks. The CAPS Services Ecosystem webinar on January 25 drew 86 participants, and 66 participants viewed the NAPIS Data Update webinar on February 1. Tentative webinar(s) for March will address the development of pest lists and the new prioritized pest list and CAPS performance measures. 2017 CAPS Recognition

The 2017 version of CAPS Recognition was announced with a call for nominations on February 2, following the call. Nominations should include a narrative on the specific activity conducted or achievement of the person or group being nominated <u>that occurred in 2016</u>. This will include a description of the activity/achievement, its significance to Pest Detection activities, and the impact of the effort. Narratives should be no more than two pages in length, and shall be submitted along with the nomination form to John and Lisa no later than COB Friday, March 17, 2017. Up to three awardees will be recognized publically at the 2017 National Plant Board Meeting (if feasible). Survey Supplies Update

The Survey Supply Procurement Program (SSPP) is working on a new communication plan. This will be discussed in more detail at the NCC meeting in McAllen. Survey Supplies Training Modules currently are being developed with a focus on ordering, shipping, maintenance, etc. The modules should start to be released in the fall or early 2018.

The IPHIS My Order screen has been updated so that SPHD State approvers can see all orders placed throughout their state, and can see supplies shipped and outstanding supplies. All others can see their orders, what has been shipped and what is outstanding, only.

Shipping of orders from the warehouse at Moore Air Base is happening at a rapid pace. All forest pest lures are going out now. Check in with constituents about any shipping errors. The sooner SSPP knows the better. Also, let SSPP know if you have critical needs ASAP. Lures manufactured in house can take time.
